Brief Introduction: Special Franciscan prayers Clarissa

A few moments of silence to quiet our minds and hearts

Hymn: Litany of Peace – cantor/singing group begins song: "God of all creation"....

All: respond in song "Let us be your peace"

Cantor/Singing Group: continues with Litany phrases

All: respond in song "Let us be your peace" until Litany is completed and music stops.

Reading: Paraphrase of the Our Father

Leader: Francis' early years of conversion were marked by his struggle with his own father. Finally, the break came. Peter Bernardone wanted back what was his. So, Francis stripped himself of his clothes and returned them to their owner. In his nakedness he then returned to God all that was His. He said "Until now I called you, Peter, my father. But from now on I can say without reserve Our Father who art in heaven. He is all my wealth and I place all my confidence in him."

Francis' life is joyfully lived in the sight of this Father. In his own creative way, he prayed the Lord's prayer and absorbed the many commentaries on it. Then in a fruitful moment of solitude he dictated to Brother Leo his own commentary which captures his deep feelings toward his Father. The Our Father was the prayer he prescribed for his brothers' and sisters' daily Office, the Our Father was the prayer he enjoined on those who sinned, the Our Father was prayed for the dead. It united the living and the dead with their Creator and Redeemer. In his paraphrase Francis marvels at the Father who is God, Creator, Redeemer, Comforter, Savior, Light, Lord, Love, Good.

Leader: Our Father

Reader # 1: Most holy, our Creator and Redeemer, our Comforter and our Savior.

Leader: Who art in heaven

Reader # 2: In the angels and the saint. You give them light so that they may have knowledge, because you, Lord, are my light. You inflame them so that they may love, because you, Lord, are love. You live continually in them and you fill them so that they may be happy, because you, Lord are the supreme good, the eternal good, and it is from you that all good comes, and without you there is no good.

Leader: Hallowed be thy name

Reader # 3: May our knowledge of you become ever clearer, so that we may realize the extent of your benefits, the steadfastness of your promises, the sublimity of your majesty and the depths of your judgements.

Leader: Thy kingdom come

Reader # 1: So that you may rig in us by your grace and bring us to your kingdom, where we shall see you clearly, love you perfectly, be happy in your company and enjoy you forever.

Leader: Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven

Reader # 3: That we may love you with our whole heart by always thinking of you; with our whole mind by directing our whole intentions towards you; and with all our strength by spending all our energies and affections of the soul and body in the service of your love alone.

Leader: But deliver us from evil

Reader # 1: Past, present and future.

Leader: Glory to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit

All: As it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.
