Fr. Christian (or another priest who is an early attendee) blesses the Tau crosses. Calls Ken's name. Ken steps forward. The priest lays hands on Ken's head and says: "May the Holy Spirit guide and strengthen you, this weekend. May you do God's will in the service of Jesus Christ". All participants raise their hands in blessing and say: "Go forth as a beacon of God's light". Fr. Christian places the Tau
